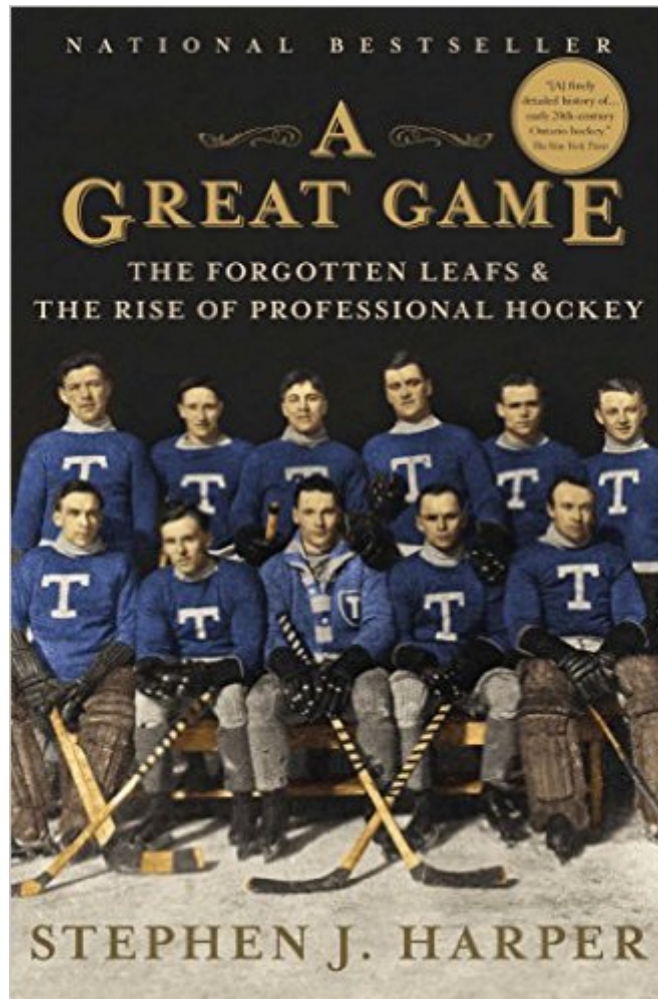

I have no idea how Stephen Harper found the time to write *A Great Game*, what with his day job of prime ministering and all. His love for the subject shines through, as does excellent research, and a firm grasp of the history of early hockey. As a Pittsburgher, I was struck by the extension of his coverage from Toronto in particular and Canada in general, to the Western Pennsylvania Hockey League. The book is surprisingly scholarly and methodical. There are times in which this makes it kind of a dry read, but it is well worth the effort.

Setting aside my acute feelings for Harper, I found this book second hand and gave it a good read before deciding not to buy it ... This isn't a hockey book, it is a Master's thesis. It looks at a fairly obscure bit of hockey history and lards on the minutia and trivia. It is primarily concerned with Toronto and as such is a fairly narrow social history. And History it is, with a capital H. On the whole it is not badly written, especially since the subject matter does not invite more exciting or gripping prose. Honestly, I like sports books as a bit of a lark, as I find them refreshing and easy reads. This is neither. If the subject matter and the style of this book are your cup of tea, well knock yourself out! You may love this laborious labour of love. If not, there are SO MANY better hockey books out there.

Covers the 1906-07 through 1908-09 seasons. Very interesting book, with some nice statistical info in the appendix. There are a few cases where this book has standings that do not appear in *Total Hockey*. The book appears to be very well researched.

This is not a popular history of hockey in Toronto. It is a detailed, academic study of the development of professional hockey and the struggle against amateurism in Toronto until 1917. If one keeps that in mind, it is a great book. Harper showcases a great talent in scholarly study on the topic, and provides a great argument in this book. He provides a clear picture of the rise of professional hockey in Toronto, and Ontario as a whole, at the start of the 20th century. It is a subject little studied by hockey historians, and this offers a great addition to those looking at a serious history of the sport. The addition of photos of nearly all the players mentioned throughout the book is also a nice touch, and despite being a rather obscure subject makes for a fairly easy read.
