

A Lady's Guide to Kiss a Rake is the 2nd book in the Misadventures of the heart series... which means that it includes a ton of references to events in the first book and assumes that you already know everything about those characters. The first 3 chapters are terribly confusing if you have not read An Earl's Guide to Catch a Lady; I did not read the first book, but I have enough details to

squash any desire to do so. Jo accepts a wage to kiss a particular rake and proceeds to enact a plan towards that goal. Concerned for her reputation, her brother and other male friends watch her continually while her friends try to run interference with some amusing results. Jo also engages in charity "projects" with her friends which involve rescuing women from their abusers. All of her male acquaintances are quite concerned about the danger in which this places Jo. When their project naturally has some unexpected bumps, Jo's life is endangered in a very predictable fashion. The bulk of the book involves conversations at balls, in gardens, libraries or drawing rooms. While that's rather usual for a Regency era novel, I found the conversations particularly annoying and insipid. There is some quickly narrated action that leaves a great number of details unknown. Some characters simply "know" things... via magic, I suppose. The book desperately needs an editor to clean up the grammar and choose the correct homophone (passed-past, to-too, accept-except, etc). A really good editor might liven up the dialog or dramatize the action because a rescue should really take up at least as much time as a love scene. I almost feel like I must've read an entirely different story than other reviewers who gave me high hopes for this tale.

I loved this book! I was chuckling out loud almost the whole way through. The story is at times light-hearted and other times a bit suspenseful. The main characters are well developed and the dialogue witty. I hated the villain, so that character was also well written. I took a star off just because the editing is not that great. I think if the author just had a friend read her work, they would catch the mistakes. There is so much garbage out there in Kindle land. You know, 20 pages of bad writing, and then another 50 stories of "Bonus Content". aargh. This Is Not That! This was a really fun read. No, it's not Jane Austen, but it was quite a delightful few hours for me. For mature audiences (1 or 2 pretty tame premarital sex scenes and a brief torture scene) I think this is book 2 in a series, not sure because I haven't read the other book yet. No Cliffhanger! More please.

I do so love historical romances. I just don't understand why so many writers feel so compelled to turn what could be a marvellous historical romance, into just another Scooby Doo Mystery. This one, as many of the others, was going along fine and dandy, romance was beginning to bloom. Then came the sabotage, and the kidnapping(s), the torture session, the wild and wacky rescue, then the now rushed, ending. I could have done quite nicely with the romance. Had the author not had to include a snippet from every murder mystery ever conceived, perhaps she wouldn't have apparently tired of the whole thing, and rushed the ending so. But, it did finally end, just before I threw the thing down in frustration at the fact that it apparently was not going to end. If you can look past all the suspense nonsense, or if that's what you like in historical romances, then this is great!

What an adventure! I could hardly put this story down, and I had finals to study for. Lol other than a few typos, this was an excellent story. Strong characters, even the secondary ones. Looking forward to read about the Middletons. Make sure you have a comfy place to sit and you are prepared for a gripping story.

I was in the mood for something light and funny and this fit the bill. Is it the best a Regency Romance, no, but it put a smile on my face and I enjoyed the character's a lot. I didn't read book 1 and really didn't feel lost in reading this one first. Not only are our H/h entertaining with their banter, but I also laughed at the secondary character's - well maybe not the brother of the h. If you are used to the decorum of rules of society in this time period, they don't exist in this story. But, I wasn't interested in that when I went searching in my library for a humorous book. Maybe if I wanted a true regency romance, I would have scored it lower. So be warned if you are a stickler because you may not like it. We get HEA which I enjoyed, no cliffhanger, lovemaking that I found passionate and mildly descriptive. We get a very bumpy road to romance.
