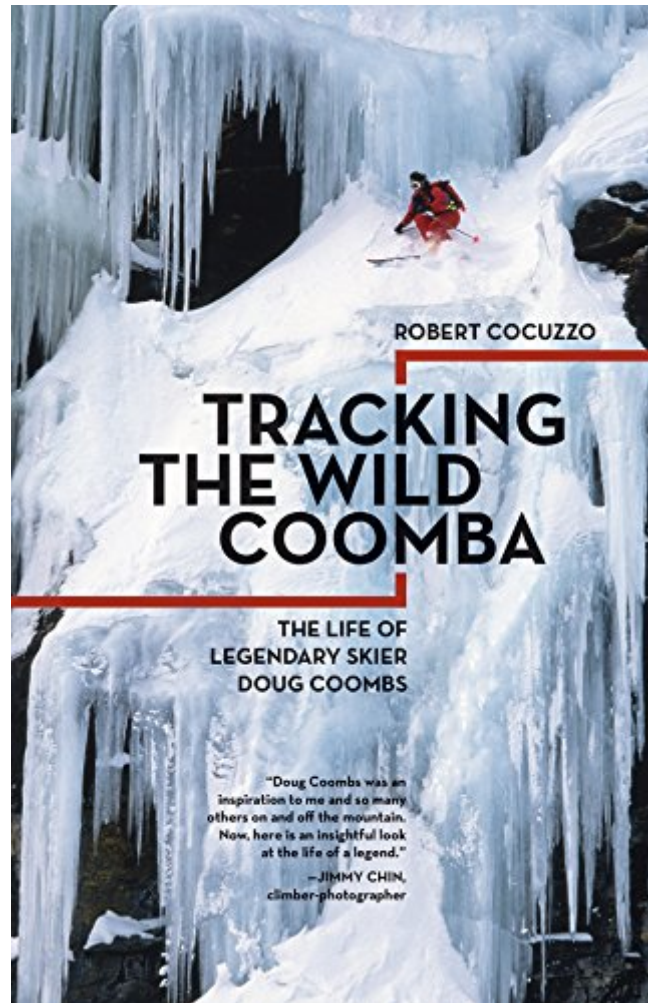

Reading Tracking the Wild Coomba is like eavesdropping on the cool kids. Cocuzzo takes you to the heart of Doug Coombs' life, where you can unabashedly marvel at what made this man (and his inner circle) so extraordinary. To read this book is to know the pleasures and perils of a life lived at the top, and on the edge.

Cocuzzo beautifully portrays the larger than life personality of Coombs, and by the end, you feel as if you yourself skied the steep with the Wild Coomba. Cocuzzo's unique use of time by interweaving the story of Coombs' life with his own personal account of skiing the very same mountains made it an enjoyable page-turner that you can't put down.

I lived in Teton Village Wyoming in the late 90's and Wilson for ten years. Doug Coombs was an event within himself. Big mountain skiing is filled huge egos, and even bigger personalities. Doug would have them all eating out his hands with his amazing vision of the possibilities in the mountains. He was able to envision the boundless potentials, but also inspire other adventurers that they were a part of his world. This book was able to evoke some serious emotions from me. The skiing community is a pretty tight as well as sensitive to outsiders. Rob has done a fantastic job of being respectful to this underpinning of the ski culture. This book is more than an account of a tragic accident, but a celebration of an inspiring individual. Doug was my hero. The day he died truly broke my heart. This book made me smile with the energy of the community, the love of his wife, and the respectful tribute to his son "David". You really have covered all the bases with this book. It's pretty funny how in his absence Doug Coombs was able to inspire from the great unknown and take

someone else on a life changing adventure.

Cocuzzo takes a book which could easily have been "man skis various exotic locations, confirms hypothesis that hero was a swell guy" and makes it so much more. The book is a fascinating look at a person most avid skiers admire, and provides a great view into the life and mentality of big mountain skiing pioneers who forged lives and livings doing what they love. It's very hard to tell a story that already has an ending, and Cocuzzo makes a compelling and emotional read out of his own travels, his well-researched vignettes and observations and illuminating conversations with Coombs' family and friends.

As a skier who grew-up skiing a small bump in the Midwest with a poster of Doug Coombs on my wall, I could completely understand the author's fascination with Coombs - probably the greatest big mountain skier in history. We are taken not only on a journey through Coomb's life, but the life of a writer, and more importantly a skier, as he follows Coombs' life in the mountains, skiing where he skied. It was a very enjoyable book in a genre of ski literature which is far too small. Skiing is a sport with endless tales to tell - most are told orally on the chairlifts and bars of the mountain world. I'm thankful that Cocuzzo put these stories on paper for all of us to enjoy.

I loved the way he wrote this book, switching back and forth between Doug's story and Robert's. The first chapter has a number of editorial mistakes that need to be corrected, which almost made me not read the book. However, starting with the second chapter, those errors were gone and the book flowed smoothly. It's full of interesting information that was well-researched. Robert unfolds the story gradually so that the reader stays interested and excited as the book progresses. I'm buying several more copies to give to my skiing buddies with the instructions to "read and pass on!" Loved the book! Thank you, Robert.
