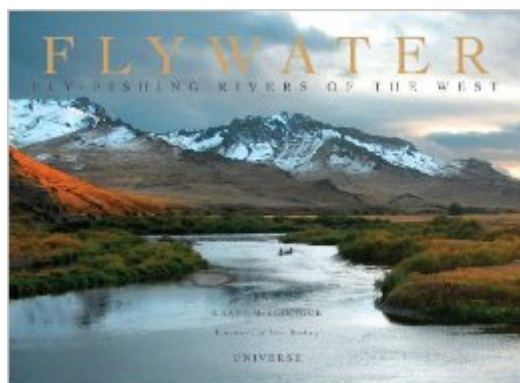

This book was absolutely beautiful. The photographers were excellent and the size of the book is good, I only wished that the pictures were not cut in the middle, that was the one problem I had with this book.

Good photos and covered some great areas in the west to fish, but the pictures are a bit grainy and lacking in color quality.

This is a breathtaking work, filled with imagery that will draw you in and make you wish for the chance to get out into nature and experience the locations for yourself. I do not often purchase books purely for imagery, but after I opened this one I knew I had to own it. As an angler, you will be reminded of one of the strongest reasons we go to the waters. If you are not an angler, or are curious about this endeavor, this book may well bring you to commit to it. The vistas shown are exceptional, and even the occasional use of muted or lower resolution imagery cannot detract from the natural and personal feel of the work.
